IMPORTANT TIPS:

1. **Seek Medical Help.** Never hesitate to get checked out by medical professionals even if you think you may be okay. Don't substitute your judgement for that of an experienced medical professional. If you do, it could be used against you in court.

2. **Take Photographs.** It is important to take pictures of the incident scene, damaged vehicles and people involved.
3. **Don't Talk to the other Driver's Insurance Company.** Never give an oral (verbal) statement to the other side's insurance company. If you do, you might regret it.
4. **Preserve Evidence.** It is vitally important to preserve the vehicles and physical evidence of an accident. For example, in cases where a passenger is ejected from the vehicle, it is necessary to examine the seatbelt to determine if it was functioning properly. If the physical evidence is discarded, the claim may be barred.
5. **Don't leave without vital information.** Unless your injuries cause you to do otherwise, do not leave the scene of the wreck until you have protected the scene, called and assisted an officer, identified the other driver, obtained pertinent information about all witnesses and made notes.
